

Wet Wet Wet have confirmed a free concert on the Isle of Arran, in conjunction with the Radio 1 Road Show, on Monday the 13th of July. The Road show will start at 10.00 a.m. and go on air at 11.00 a.m.. Between 12.00-12.30 p.m. the Wets will be interviewed and play 2 songs. The concert will start at about 12.30 p.m., with most of the performance being broadcast live on Radio 1.

This is the first time in 25 years that Radio 1 have interupted daytime programming to broadcast a live show.

The concert will be an open air gig with a capacity of 10,000 and will be held in Lamlash, 3 miles from Brodick ferry point, and will be clearly signposted.

Caledonian MacBrayne, the ferry company, hope to provide additional ferry services on the day and precise information about this will be widely publicised as soon as possible. Details about regular ferry times, campsites, Bed & Breakfast etc. may be obtained from the Arran Tourist Information Centre on (0770) 2401.

Wet Wet Wet HIGH ON THE HAPPY SIDE

TOUR REPORT MARCH '92 arch, according to
psychologists, is the second
most depressing month of the
year. Not this time. For in
March this year, Wet Wet Wet
set off on a tour of Britain
which will remain in the
memories of tens of
thousands of people for years to come. They
saw to it that depression of any kind was
totally extinct.

Even the title of the tour, named after the album "High On The Happy Side" brings a smile, and the thoughts of seeing the band live once again crushes any dark thoughts.

On March 2, 1992, Wet Wet Wet set out on an exhausting schedule of 16 dates which

spanned Scotland and England and was to leave in its wake a trail of happy fans and astonished critics.

Living in the south of England, I was to pick up the tour at Wembley and I could hardly wait. However, I didn't have to wait for rave reviews as the tour progressed, from the press, radio, T V. and various friends scattered around the country One of them called me the morning after the Wets opened Manchester, breathless with admiration and still high as a kite from the electric atmosphere of the night before. It was the first Wets concert

she had attended but now as a totally converted fan, it certainly won't be the last.

By the time the tour reached Wembley, the praise from even the most hard-bitten critics was getting almost embarassing! From the strangest quarters of the media came phrases like "increasing musical maturity", "the best live performance I've ever seen", "the Wets at

their most wonderful"

So it was wih great excitement that I waited for the band to appear on stage amidst an audience of a surprisingly wide age range. On the band's last tour (Holding Back The River), I had noticed that the younger fans brought big sister or brother along, and in some cases, Mum and Dad. This time around there were Grannies, Aunties and Uncles, right down to toddlers perched on shoulders.

Suddenly, accompanied by an ecstatic roar from the audience, they were there, on stage, immediately breaking into "Make It Tonight", sounding like a thousand nights of rehearsal, hard work and organisation, looking terrific and fresh as the morning dew


And that lighting! So perfectly orchestrated

and breathtakingly colourful that it *almost* detracted from the band themselves!

It is always nice to see the Wets again - like friends you haven't seen for ages. Such is the Wet's band-audience relationship There's Graeme, clearly enjoying every note, masterfully handling a huge battery of keyboards, Graeme Duffin, sounding more like a guitar hero every day, Marti as pleased to see us as we are to see him, and so laid back he nearly falls over, and Tommy belting those skins like there's no tomorrow

I've never seen such an enthusiastic response. Everyone on their feet, yelling fit to bust, arms waving, leaping up and down and the atmosphere is literally tingling with electricity.

"East Of The River" from "Popped In Souled Out" always brings a great response thick clouds of rainbow-coloured dry ice

billowing across the stage. Marti's vocals seem to get stronger all the time - I'm sure that boy doesn't *really* need a microphone. Wembley is leaping in delight and loving every minute.

"Sweet Surrender" from "Holding Back The River" is, of course, a classic favourite, but how come it sounds even better live? And those lasers take your breath away. If an alien dropped in from outer space, he could be forgiven for thinking that he'd forgotten to leave his own planet.

The clever stage set is a perfect backdrop for Marti's boundless energy. He makes the most of it, using every inch of space, rushing up and down steps, keeping fans happy on every side of the stage, flirting mercilessly.

The Wets are taking the arrival of the more mature side of their audience in their stride, with a kind of amused interest. Marti said, after the Sheffield gig on March 9 "I couldn't believe it, every time I sat down, most of the audience sat down too, and clapped politely after each song!"

Not so at Wembley, though. Nobody sat down, except myself when the lady behind fell off her boyfriend's shoulders and knocked me flying! I was on my feet immediately - there was no way I was going to miss any of this.

"Lip Service" is my current favourite. It never fails to get me on my feet. It's a catchy, exciting song and coupled with those mindblowing lighting effects it was almost too much at Wembley. Graeme Duffin's break on this is a stunning piece of guitar work - have another listen, it sounds better every time. This is to be the next single, then, and whoever's idea that was knows what they are doing! In the middle of the song, strobe lights throw out their strange stop-start effect, making it impossible to tear your eyes away from the stage This proves once again the Wets' incredible versatility, dabbling in dance music indeed. What next? An all night rave, perhaps. Nothing would surprise me.

But big surprises are to come.

First one is an entirely acoustic set with the two Graemes and Marti taking front stage, Marti introducing "Put The Light On" - or should I say "Keep The Light On"? Acoustic perfection at such a huge venue as Wembley must be damn near impossible to achieve. The

Wets achieve the damn near impossible It sounds wonderful, thousands of bodies swaying in time, voices joining in.

Neil Mitchell, content as ever to calmly handle the keyboards without too much limelight, now unblushingly joins Marti front-stage for "Brand New Sunrise", and for the first time something resembling a hush descends upon Wembley Neil and Marti simply create magic.


Why does "Wishing I Was Lucky" always sound brand new? I would love to know how many times the Wets have performed this song Do they just switch to automatic? It doesn't sound like it to me. It is an anthem which takes on a slightly different colour each time And Wembley is singing so enthusiastically that the band are in danger of being taken over!

Now what's happening? We're told that this is "the crowd participation bit" I thought it was already Pellow sings. "Show me one more sign, give me one more time, 'cos you gimme..." the mike is held out to the audience. Wembley yells "GIMME", Marti. "Gimme..", Wembley "GIMME" and so on which is all so nice because it's another moment of closeness. "Temptation" is, for me, extra special, on previous tours saved for the finale with much gyration and teasing. This time around we all join in with the singing and it's nice to know there's more to come.

"How Long" from "High On The Happy Side" is surely the single after next, as once you've heard it you can't stop singing it. At Wembley it sounded beautifully professional. My companion, who was not exactly a particular Wets fan, raved about this and, I hasten to add, is *now* a particular Wets fan.

Now for another total surprise. "Goodnight Girl", the Wets' brilliantly successful number one is coming up "with a little help on vocals-from Cliff Richard" Of course, no-one believes it, but sure enough, here comes the ever youthful Cliff, sort-of bounding up the steps and sort-of helps out on vocals. Here is a man who has been a star since the world began, and it is a remarkable credit to the Wets to have him as one of their greatest fans.





Not another surprise, surely, but for me the most astonishing. Is that Graeme actually taking over the vocals? You have to watch carefully if you're standing near the back because Graeme and Marti Look very similar from a distance. Marti has taken Graeme's guitar. The Average White Band's "Atlantic Avenue" is handled beautifully by Mr. Clark, and Marti looks just at home on guitar as he does on those famous vocals. More hidden talent coming out - next we'll have Neil on drums and Tommy on vocals, with Graeme and Marti taking over the horn section!



And so the evening progresses, joy upon joy, until the finale. "Holding Back The River" from the album of the same name is the ultimate sing-along. And Wembley finally raises the roof. The sheer power of so many voices coupled with the astonishing musical


power of the Wets and that stunning light show sends shivers up the spine and goose-pimples breaking out all over.

This was truly a night to remember. We are exhausted. How ever must the band feel? The fourteenth date of the tour with three more to go. There has to be something very, very special about these guys. They seem to re-charge their energy by sheer hard work and the love

of it.

So that's it then. Or is it? No way. You just have time to take a deep breath and reflect upon all this wonder, and then? Yes brace yourselves for "High On The Happy Side" Part Two! The Wets go on the road again in July. A short time to re-charge YOUR batteries. Isn't it great to feel that there is something looming on the horizon which will bring yet more surprises and guaranteed musical perfection delivered in a way that only Wet Wet Wet can deliver.

I, for one, can hardly wait.






