

ne single, a cover of the TROGGS classic, "Love Is All Around" was released on May 9th.

The flip side to "Love Is All Around" is an Arthur Baker remixed version of "I Can Give You Everything" taken from the highly successful "Popped In Souled Out" album.

It comes in four formats; 7", MC and two separate CD's. CD 1 features a cover of "Ain't No Stoppin' Us Now/Le Freak", by McFadden and Whitehead. Bob Marleys' "Is This Love" features on CD 2, released on May 16th. Both tracks were recorded on their recent "Greatest Hits" UK tour.

The song will only be available on the soundtrack album for the film, "Four Weddings

and A Funeral" released on May 9th, also featuring Elton John, Sting, Barry White, Gloria Gaynor, and many more.

The film, starring amongst others, Andy McDowell and Rowan Atkinson, reached number one status in America after only six weeks of its limited release. It has become so popular that it is now being shown in all major cinemas across America.

The band attended the premiere to "Four Weddings and A Funeral" on May 11th at the Odeon Leicester Square, London. The band wore full Scottish Highland dress and entered the cinema accompanied by a Piper.

It was released in Britain on May 13th, lets hope it can do the same here.

UK Greatest Hits TOUR


WET WET embarked on yet another phenomenally successful UK tour. As always, the concerts were sell-outs, with fans of all ages celebrating "End Of Part One - Their Greatest Hits".

Setting off in Cardiff on November 24th 1993, and touching down in Sheffield, Whitley Bay, Birmingham, Manchester, London and Glasgow, they ended the tour with a show stopping concert in Dublin on December 14th 1993.

The "Greatest Hits" tour was watched by 90,000 fans over the 12 date tour. Here are reviews of some of these concerts by those who went along and enjoyed the "sweet soul music..."

SHEFFIELD ARENA
NOVEMBER 25TH 1993

n this cold November evening the WETS hit Sheffield arena. After spending ages choosing my merchandise I made my way to my seat. Looking around, I saw the wide range of the audience. The WETS have certainly got mass appeal.

The atmosphere prior to the band taking the stage was hushed excitement with eager anticipation for the bands arrival. At 8.45 p.m. the curtains start to part, accompanied by an ecstatic roar, to reveal the band. Launching straight into "Sweet Surrender" everyone is singing

and dancing.

They plough through the old favourites; "Sweet Little Mystery", Angel Eyes" and "Temptation", with some crowd participation, of course!

"Lip Service" always sends everyone into a frenzy. After the song finishes, Marti leaves the stage and we are left in the very capable hands of Mr. Graeme Clark. "We Can Work It Out" goes down a storm. All I can say is watch out Marti!

"Wishing I Was Lucky" sounds as fresh as ever. It is followed by an excellent version of the McFadden and Whitehead track, "Ain't No Stoppin' Us Now".

Things slow down a bit after as we are presented with "Blue For You", "How Long" and "This Time", which never fails

to bring a lump to the throat.

"East Of The River" sees everyone jumping up and down in unison, led by Marti of course!

"Julia Says" a new song, so new that Marti clutches the lyrics in his hands. A sure fire hit if it's released in the future. A rapturous applause is given at the end of it.

"I Can Give You Everything" always seems to be a particular favourite and it goes down brilliantly live as the audience join in and shout, "c'mon with your everything".

There is only one song which can be played to finish the show. This is the number one song "Goodnight Girl". Looking around the arena you can see a mass of swaying arms. The WETS move towards the end of the song, but there is enough time for "Sing-along-a-Marti". The audience is split into three with Marti and both Graeme's taking a section each. I have to say that Marti's side were the best!

Soon the show is over and the WETS make their way to the edge of the stage to take a bow. The audience continue to applaud long after the band have gone. WET WET WET are still the best live act around and none of us can wait until the next time!

t was more that 18 months since the wets had last played the Glasgow SE&CC. Tickets had sold out almost immediately as the home crowd continued to support Wet Wet Wet.

December 8th 1993 was not only wet outside by triple the downpour inside, as thousands of fans flooded the venue.

The first notes of "Sweet Surrender" began a catalogue of hits that has made Wet Wet Wet a household name.

From the old to the new, they next played "Shed A Tear" and by this time the jostling crowd were in full voice. Jostling became jumping as the wets launched into "Sweet Little Mystery".

Changing styles they launched into the Bob Marley classic "Is This Love" followed by their own reggae venture "Maybe Tomorrow".

Next came their concert anthem "Temptation". This track has no boundaries when it comes to being played live. It seems to change shape with every

tour. No other song allows Marti to show off his vocal abilities and attract such admiration either!

The band are best known for their slow numbers but they do admirably on "Lip Service". It never fails to get the audience on its feet and dancing to the beat, the whole place is now shaking almost plunging off the richter scale!

As Marti disappears from the stage, to change out of his eye-catching purple suit, Graeme takes the opportunity to grace us with his blossoming vocal talents. A rendition of the Beatles song, "We Can Work It Out" echoes through the hall, giving Marti a run for his money!

We do a U-turn back to the beginning with "Wishing I Was Lucky" only to head back, once more, to a time before the world had heard of Wet Wet Wet. "Ain't No Stoppin Us Now" followed by "Le Freak" sent the parents wild while their children ran for cover!

The highlight for me, was the collaboration of three of the most beautiful Wet Wet Wet songs; "Blue For You/How Long/This Time". A silence enveloped the crowd as the dimly lit stage projected the mood of these tracks.

"With A Little Help..." was celebrated in style. The band certainly enjoy this number as it will always be a reminder of their first number one. "Hold Back The River" and "East Of The River" heighten the hysteria even more as the crowd "jump for Marti!" Testing new waters, the band perform a "little ditty" entitled "Julia Says", to a glorious reception. They can rest assured

that the new material will go down well as long as the Wet Wet Wet mark is firmly stamped on it.

No introduction is necessary as "Angel

Eyes" fills the air. A classic track, if ever there was one, the crowd sway to the music and harmonise with Marti, every word embedded in the walls of the SE&CC. "Have we got any energy left?", asks Tommy, need he even ask. "I Can Give You Everything" rocks the house and the crowd are, once again, pounding the floor to the funky beat. Greame Clark takes centre stage as his bass solo becomes more popular on every tour. The fireworks go off

and I have yet another heart attack. The

light shows are always amazing, but can be

a bit startling!

The band leave the stage but shadows appears minutes later. The stage is black and the tune is unrecognisable. The band materialise on the dark stage, and the tune becomes recognisably, "High On The Happy Side", the title track to their third album. The concert is winding down to a close as Marti's breathy vocals fade.

Only one more song to go, "Goodnight Girl", the bands most successful record to date. Such a simple song that seems to become so much more complex live. All the instruments take on a role which removes the simplicity. "Sing-along-a-Marti" creates an outbreak of laryngitis in Glasgow that December night!

Soon it's all over and Wet Wet Wet are gone, leaving behind them the screams of thousands of satisfied fans, who moments later were planning for the next time...

To our extreme disappointment Graeme announces that the end has come. We all scream to get them to play more. They leave as quickly as they came.

Just as I begin to give up hope, Marti bounces back on stage, eyes twinkling. next Greame emerges followed by a shy looking Neil who runs back to his keyboard. Tommy, the most energetic of them all, runs onto the stage back to his drum kit smiling good naturdley and dripping with sweat. Greame Duffin walks on looking happy, as always, and appears very calm.



This is only "End Of Part One", hopefully they will be many more parts to come, and that they return to Ireland soon.











The Wets played a FREE show in Tower Records, in Glasgow, to launch their latest single "Shed A Tear".

The band had intended to play their short set, but The Westminster City Council stated that HMV must have a license to have live entertainment. The Westminster City Council in conjunction with the police and fire brigade, therefore, banned the Wets from playing.


