

INTHE STUDIO

THE STORY SO FAR...

Ithough there has been no new releases or live shows from Wet Wet Wet for some months now, the band have not been resting at all, in fact quite the opposite! They have been tucked away in studios all over Britain for the past eight months recording the follow up to the hugely successful 'Picture This'.

After the exhausting world-wide Picture This Tour, which ended in December 1995, the band came home to spend time with their families and see their friends again before starting work on their fifth studio album (excluding Memphis Sessions, Wet Wet Wet Live at the Royal Albert Hall or the End of Part One Their Greatest Hits).

They had been living in one another's pockets for months & months during '95, so they all upped & disappeared to foreign climes for an extremely well deserved holiday and hoping to see some sunshine instead of the inside of a tour bus, Graeme and family went to the exotic destination of Acapulco, Tommy took his family to Singapore and Dubai, which he had adored when they played there during the Far East leg of the World Wide tour. Marti relaxed in a private villa in Acapulco and Neil decided to stay at home to catch up with friends and family.

The holiday feeling did not last for long - as soon as they were home they all had one thing in mind - the next album, especially Graeme Clark who never switches off from work!

When they got back together they were all buzzing with new ideas - because they had been touring for so long, they had not had time to write the new material for the album on the road. But everyone had some thoughts on how the new album should sound and when they got back from their holidays they started to go along to each others houses and let each other hear their ideas for chords and lyrics. Now that they had started to bounce ideas around, they began to put pen to paper, and things started to roll along towards another great album.

The band realised that they would have to go away from Glasgow to work and take the ideas further or they just wouldn't get enough work done! So the record company sourced studios that had all the technical features that the band needed and they left home again.

At the beginning of April they flew down to a remote studio in southern England to actually start to pull all their ideas together for the album, which

of 'Ten'. The studio is a converted old manor house in the middle of some beautiful countryside, and the band stay there all the time when they are recording, this is great for the guys - they each have their own space and it's much more informal than staying in hotels, which they had seen enough of when they were touring! Everyone can get together and everyone starts to work as a team, it gives much more of a family feel and keeps everyone relaxed. The staff at the studio specialise in providing an excellent service to the band but keeping very much in the background and they have become very good friends over the year.

Many people are surprised at how long it takes for an album to be recorded, but it is a slow and very precise process. Once the melody and lyrics are written, the individual parts for each of the


instruments has to worked out. This changes constantly as the song develops, and everyone comes up with new ideas and suggestions, the song can change direction many times during this period and everyone has to keep a very fluid approach to the song so that they are convinced that the end result is the very best of the best!

They also need to work out arrangements and write music for any instruments being played by session players i.e. not a member of the band, but string instruments or horns etc. Fiachra Trench, who has worked with them on previous albums, was involved in helping with the arrangements for the string sections on a few of the tracks. The string sections were then recorded in a couple of separate sessions, usually in a studio in London as that is where many of the musicians are based.

The other session musicians involved were brass players, and this was a chance for the guys to meet up with Paul Spong, Neil Sidwell and Jamie Talbot, who they have worked with many times before, both in the studio and on tour. Indeed, we are sure that any of you who saw any of the live shows in 1995 will agree that the horn section really add a certain something to the performances!!

Then comes the actual recording, and generally, every instrument's part in a song is recorded separately. Sections of the song can be recorded many times, (as each musician will complain!) before everyone is





happy with their performance - they are all perfectionists and want to make sure that they are achieving the very highest standards. They all have favourite songs but sometimes just can't put their finger on what makes it special for them.; Neil's favourite track is 'Beyond The Sea', where as Marti loves the track entitled 'Strange'.

As usual, the band were doing the production work themselves, with Graeme Clark being particularly interested in this side of the process. This means that even if they are recording, for example, Tommy's drum parts, the rest of the guys may still be in the studio and working away on another song. Paul Spong who you may recognise from previous credits on albums and tours, took a break from his own projects and popped along to the studio to have a cup of tea and a gossip with the guys and to see how everything was

As the weeks and months passed things were progressing very well, and they had the opportunity to work with Axel Kroell, who had done some of the production work on a previous albums, the debut album, Popped In Souled Out and again on High On The Happy Side.

going.

Marti said "it was brilliant to work with Axel again as it was great to see a friendly face, we always get on so well with Axel"

After the success of co-writing with Chris Difford of Squeeze on 'Picture This', ('She Might Never Know' and 'Love is My Shepherd'), the band wanted to do more. On this album they have collaborated with the famous songwriting
team of Terry Brittan and Graeme Lyle,
who have previously written tracks for
such artists as Tina Turner and Cliff
Richard. This collaboration produced
one of Graemes favourite tracks,
entitled 'If I Never See You Again'
Graeme was amazed at the comparative
ease with which Terry & Graham
approached the project, they have
worked together so much that they
are like two parts of a whole, one
fluid motion!

But as Graeme said "If fruitful things were going to happen they would happen very quickly", and things certainly are looking that way.

The sessions could last for months at a time, but they all made time to come back home to visit their families, especially Tommy & Graeme who have children who keep asking when daddy is coming home. But everyone needs a break from the intense upside down life of being in the

studio and working right through the night and sleeping for most of the day, they kept phoning the office and we'd be tired at the end of the day and they would be only having their breakfast!

During one of the sessions, when Marti had taken a short break at home On they way back down to the studio Marti went to the best butchers in Glasgow and bought some Black Pudding, Sliced Sausage and Potato Scones. He carried it down with him on the plane, and when he arrived at the studio he surprised everyone by cooking

a full Scottish Breakfast for the band and all the staff at the studio - It certainly surprised the rest of the band who came out of the studio following the lovely smell of home cooking!

It is important that they can all feel relaxed and happy while they are in the studio so during the summer months, when they were not required to be in the studio, the guys took a holiday to keep them fresh and focused on work - as it is difficult to produce your best if you are tired!. Tommy went to Portugal for a fortnight with his family, Neil went to the Spanish island of Ibiza to relax in the Mediterranean sunshine, Graeme took his family to an island of the Italian coast called Capri, Graeme Duffin went to the West Coast of Florida with his family while Marti went to unwind in the East Coast of Florida.

Every now & again the A&R people from Mercury (the record company) would go down to the studio and sit in on the sessions and listen to the tapes to hear how everything has gone to date and they are just knocked back by what they've heard so far.

Everyone here in the Splash office are all really excited about hearing the new album, as each one just keeps getting better and better - unfortunately we will just have to wait!

We know that you are all eager for any news that we have on the album, all we know at the moment is that it should be released in the first quarter of 1997 but we will keep you up to date with any new information we have concerning release dates or singles via the phoneline and newsletters.



Brought the end to a fantastic year


You had a cold, cold heart, how could this be?






